Winter Travel Safety Tips-Preparation is key

Roads in Washington can be challenging to navigate with temperatures dropping. Sheets of ice on roads, or the occasional snow dumping can leave you stranded or worse if unprepared. Here are some tips to keep you ready and safe when on the road this winter-

1. Slow things down-speed plays a key role when driving on icy roads. Leave plenty of room between you and other drivers, and keep things slow. In the event you do slide you will have a better chance of regaining control if you keep your speed down.

2. If you start to slide, slowly turn the steering wheel in the direction that the rear of your car is

sliding.

3. Keep tires inflated to the right pressure recommended by the manufacturer.

4. Replace worn wiper blades before the weather worsens- check them now and be ready

5. Keep your car stocked with essentials: jumper cables, portable jump starter, small snow shovel, emergency blanket, gallon of water.

6. Keep gas tank topped off for long road trips.


Slow Down!

Unfortunately we are still experiencing speeding in our neighborhood. Sunwood Lakes community is a 25MPH speed limit zone. If you are reading this and you are someone who speeds in our neighborhood, you are putting yourself and others at risk. In an effort to to do what we can on our end, the HOA board recently reached out to the non emergency Sheriff line about getting speed readers and patrol cars present in our neighborhood to serve as a deterrent to speeding. We also found out that we qualified for the Traffic Calming Program through Thurston County, which would allow for adding speed bumps to our problem areas. We can go through the petition process, however, because of budget cuts with the county, we would have to pay for the project and it would require support from the majority of our community.
